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

The Holy Prophet (sa) revealed to mankind the religion of Islam over 1400 years ago, and in doing so, brought forth a message of compassion and acceptance, a message of equality and justice. In today's world, such a message is crucially needed as hate and anger grow increasingly more prevalent in our society.



By looking at the inspirational example of the Holy Prophet (sa) and his conduct, we can all aim to not only replicate his teachings and strive to become better people, but also to inspire others to do the same as we spread the message of the true Islam.




#### THE HOLY PROPHET (SA) AND EQUALITY

One way in which we can aim to replicate the teachings of the Holy Prophet (sa) is by looking at how he treated people with equality. In his final address to the Muslim Ummah after completing his farewell pilgrimage, the Holy Prophet (sa) gave parting words on how we should treat each other. He stated:



"O men, what I say to you, you must hear and remember. All Muslims are as brethren to one another. All of you are equal. All men, whatever nation or tribe they may belong to, and whatever station in life they may hold, are equal. Even as the fingers of the two hands are equal, so are human beings equal to one another. No one has any right, any superiority to claim over another. You are like brothers. O men, your God is One and your ancestor is one. An Arab possesses no superiority over a non-Arab, nor does a non-Arab over an Arab. A white man is in no way superior to a black, nor for that matter is a black man better than a white, but only to the extent to which he discharges his duty to God and man. The most honoured among you in the sight of God is the most righteous among you..." (Musnad Imam Ahmad Bin Hanbal, Hadith no. 19774)

Inheritance laws were restructured to ensure women received a rightful share of wealth. Marriage practices were reformed, with women now allowed to have a legal claim to divorce. The Holy Prophet (sa) emphasized the importance of kindness and respect within marriage, and completely changed how women were treated. Today, we can look at his shining example on how we should conduct ourselves in marriage. By looking at his example, we should all treat our partners with mutual respect and gentleness. In doing so, we can clearly see how the Holy Prophet (sa) was a true advocate for the rights of women.



#### THE HOLY PROPHET (SA) AND JUSTICE

The Holy Prophet (sa) firmly upheld the role of justice, ensuring that everyone was held to the same rules and standards irrespective of their status or wealth. He once declared that "By Allah, if Fatimah, the daughter of Muhammad, were to steal, I would cut off her hand." (Sahih al-Bukhari; Sahih Muslim)


This was a testament to his standards on law: justice applies to everyone equally. It did not matter if someone belonged to even his own family, he made it clear that no one is exempt. His advocacy for the law and justice extended to even economic justice and workers' rights. The Holy Prophet (sa) condemned exploitative business practices and strove for honesty and trust in business dealings. In a hadith it is narrated that:

"Delayed payment by a rich person is an act of injustice." (Şaḥīḥ al-Bukhārī 2166)

In a society where the weak were often exploited, the Holy Prophet (sa)'s insistence on justice ensured dignity and fairness for all. By trying to conduct ourselves in our own personal business ventures and dealings through the lens of Islam and the Holy Prophet (sa), we are sure to stay righteous.

The Holy Prophet (sa) was a true beacon for human rights. Through his promotion of equality, women's rights, and an insistence on justice, he laid the foundation for teachings that, more than a millennium later, would still hold true. His character demonstrates to us all the true meaning of what it means to be a Muslim and continues to serve as an inspiration on how we should live out our day-to-day lives.


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




## SPIRITUAL TREASURES

An introduction to the works of The Promised Messiah (as)

#### The Need for the Imam

In "The Need for the Imam", first published in 1898, Hazrat Mirza Ghulam Ahmad (as), the Promised Messiah and Mahdi (as), explains the essential role of a Divinely appointed Imam in every age. From the Qur'an, Hadith, and historical examples, he establishes that without recognizing the Imam of the age, a believer risks dying a "death of ignorance," as stated in an authentic Hadith recorded in Musnad Ahmad. Huzoor (as) clarifies that the mere experience of true dreams or revelations does not qualify one as an Imam.

True Divine appointment is marked by a perfect spiritual condition, bestowed by God Himself. The Imam of the age is a divinely nurtured guide who is sustained by continuous revelation, extraordinary moral strength, profound knowledge, and an unshakable reliance on God. Through him, the light of spirituality radiates upon others—enabling ordinary believers to receive inspiration, strengthening them in prayer, and empowering them in service of faith.

He writes about the distinctive qualities of the Imam: unmatched moral strength, leadership, encompassing knowledge of divine truths, extraordinary patience under trials, profound trust in God, and a constant stream of pure revelation that uplifts and guides the community. In contrast, individual inspirations or saintly experiences are but reflections of the Imam's greater light. The Promised Messiah (as) further warns that rejecting the Imam of the age leads to spiritual ruin, just as the Jewish rabbis who awaited the Holy Prophet Muhammad (sa) ultimately rejected him out of prejudice. God has always maintained this system of Imamat to safeguard faith, just as He has placed order in the physical world.

Toward the end, Hazrat Masih Maud (as) declares openly that he himself is the Imam of the age, raised by God as the Promised Messiah and Mahdi at the turn of the century. His mission is to resolve disputes among Muslims, especially regarding the life and death of Jesus (as), to break the Cross, and to revive the true spirit of Islam. He cites numerous signs in support of his claim, including the solar and lunar eclipses, the spread of plague, the acceptance of thousands of prayers, and the fulfilment of prophecies.


